**The International Genealogical Index, which is known as IGI, is a system that can be used. It is a translation history of filmed municipal and ecclesiastic records. This information have come from various locations from participating regional locations all over the globe.**

**The other information source that you can use is known as the Our 'Ancestral File or just simply AF'. This information source is used to gather the facts about the member's contributions over time.**

**So, how can these databases help you? First off, the IGI is one of the best records of old births and wedding history information from the LDS. It has records of those that have been born, passed away and wedded beginning from well back to 1500. Most of this facts are from the USA, European countries and North america.**

**Generally, info on members has been able to expose quite a bit about family ancestry from these resources.**

**How can you use the LDS's selection of information? In the state of "Utah" the selection of these microfilms is located. The resources are located at the Family History Library which has a vast collection of information regarding the entire society.**



**Yet, you don't have to travel there to discover them. There are divisions (some 4000 of them) around the nation and globe that can offer you help.**

**You can check out these locations, ask for information or even lease the information for your on site analysis needs. Actually, they have extended this search capability to the world wide web as well. You can check out the selection at this place at FamilySearch [dotorg]. or do a Internet search and type in the name!**

**The web page actually provides for free analysis information and a wide range of tools --such as the Ancestral File (AF), the International Genealogical Index, the Social Security Death Index, and the 1880 United States Federal Census information. This is an ideal place for you to get started with your search!**

### **-Use Your Genes For Genealogy**

**What if you could have your DNA examined at a regional lab and then reported to you. It could be then used to track-down your family members bloodline, depending on your DNA well back into history.**

**How can this be possible when DNA is something that is rather new? The fact is that nowadays, DNA is benefit to the genealogical search quite a bit. - **Who was their family growing up? Did they have aunts, uncles, or cuz, distant family members that they remember? Collect the same information for these people as well.**

- **Are there close family members that are residing close by them?**

- **Are there close family members that are buried at the same graveyard as relatives? If so, were and what were their names?**

- **Ask about their residing family members and the deceased family members. Is there anyone in family still in existence that's a generation above them that you can talk to? If so, how can you contact them?**

**Asking these concerns is just the beginning, but a powerful one. You want to open a line of communication and interaction between you and those that you have in existence and available to you. One of the best methods to do this is to use stories.**

### **-The Benefits Of Stories**

**Although information are an important aspect of the procedure of learning about those that are in your ancestral ties, it's also essential for you to consider the stories that these people can tell you, too.**
